RELATIONSHIP WITH THE FATHER

"Luke, I am your father."

You probably recognize that famous line, even if you've never watched Star Wars before. Darth Vader's reveal wasn't just a shocking plot twist but it was a moment that changed everything for Luke. Imagine the mix of emotions: disbelief, betrayal, anger, confusion.

RELATIONSHIP WITH THE FATHER

Whether your relationship with your earthly father has been one of warmth or one of wounding, it likely shaped the way you view authority, identity, and even God.

What comes to mind when you think about your own father?

And a deeper question I'd like you to consider is: does your experience with your earthly father affect how you relate to our Heavenly Father?

Jesus Knew the Father Deeply

One of the most powerful truths in Scripture is that Jesus knew His Father intimately. So closely, in fact, that He said: "I am in the Father and the Father is in me." (John 14:11)

Jesus didn't speak of his own accord and wasn't just doing His own thing. He said clearly: "The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work." (John 14:10) "If you really know me, you will know my Father as well." (John 14:7) In other words, if you want to know what the Father is like (or who He is), we just have to look at Jesus.

Reflect on how He loves, listen to how He speaks, observe how He forgives, heals, weeps, and rejoices. Everything Jesus said and did reveals the heart of God the Father.

You Were Made for Relationship

Jesus didn't just model a relationship with the Father but He invites us into it. "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love." (John 15:9)

We were created to live in relationship with God; to know Him as Father, to remain in His love, and to walk with Him daily.

When Jesus taught us how to pray, He said: "Our Father." A name of intimacy and of relationship.

Because of Jesus, we can be called children of God. "And if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ…" (Romans 8:17)

RELATIONSHIP WITH THE FATHER

Let that sink in: You are God's child. That is your identity. Not because you earned it, and not because you're perfect. But because He chose you, He redeemed you, and He called you by name.

Hear the truth of your Father's voice today: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine." (Isaiah 43:1)

YOU, ARE, HIS,

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I set you apart." (Jeremiah 1:5)

HE KNEW YOU BEFORE you were formed and He has SET YOU APART.

A Loving Father

The enemy will whisper that you're not worthy. That it's too late. That you've messed up too many times. But the voice of God says otherwise: "Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love." (Joel 2:13)

There is no sin in your life that's greater than the love of God. Jesus willingly has already paid the full price: past, present, and future. "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

So remember, that nothing, absolutely nothing, can separate you from the love of the Father: "Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons... nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39)

Come Back Home, Return to the Father

Maybe you've wandered, or life has pulled you away. Maybe you've been carrying sin or regret, unsure how God could still love you.

We remember the prodigal son who squandered everything. But then: "While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him." (Luke 15:20)

Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.

Isaiah 43:1

Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love.

Joel 2:13

RELATIONSHIP WITH THE FATHER

That's our Father.

He's not waiting to scold you. Rather, He's been watching the horizon for your return. And waiting to embrace you.

You Are Loved, Come As You Are.

So here's the invitation:
Come home. Come back to the Father.
Whether you're strong in your faith or
haven't prayed in years...
Whether you feel worthy or not...
Whether you feel close or distant...

The Father's arms are open. His love is real and His voice is calling.

So if this has stirred something inside of you, please don't leave it there...

Take a moment.

Pray.

Reach out.

Come to Mass.

Go to confession.

Or simply whisper, "Father, I'm here."

He's been waiting for you.


HIGHLIGHTS FROM RECENT EVENTS


DID YOU KNOW?

BOOK SHOWCASE


Tiny Tiny Theology - the Trinity

REFLECTION AND YOUR CALL TO ACTION

Action Prompts:

- Read Luke 15:11-32, the parable of the Prodigal son, and imagine yourself from the father's perspective in these verses.
- When praying the "Our Father" prayer that Jesus taught the disciples, reflect on how the word "Father" speaks to your spirit?
- Pray to the Father asking Him to show you/ to forgive you for/to help you with/to give you (eg. strength, wisdom, courage).
- Reflect on the following verses:

"I will live in them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people... and I will be your father, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."
(2 Corinthians 6:16,18)

"Yet, Lord, you are our father; we are the clay and you our potter: we are all the work of your hand." (Isaiah 64:7)

"See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him."

(1 John 3:1)

REFLECTION AND YOUR CALL TO ACTION

Action Prompts:

Ask yourself the following questions:

What is my relationship with God the Father, and how can I more fully trust Him and abide in Him?

Are there any negative emotions with my own father/parent that I need to ask my Heavenly father for forgiveness, grace, strength, comfort, healing, or freedom?

What does the Father's heart look like to me? How can I better understand and grasp how wide and long and high and deep God's love is for me and for others? (Ephesians 3:18)

How can I bear God's image and character to be a good parent/spouse/child to my child(ren)/spouse/parent(s)?

How can I live out my faith daily, starting with my family?

How can I be a Godly example for other fathers/parents among my friends, peers, and community?
